Irradiating fruits, vegetables, spices, pork, and chicken to kill insects and bacteria has been approved by the Food and Drug Administration over the past decade or so. Irradiation of other meats, such as beef and lamb, is being reviewed. Federal approval does not require that industry
5 adopt the process, and few food processors presently offer irradiated products.

Market studies have shown that many consumers are afraid that eating irradiated foods may cause cancer, despite scientific studies that prove the safety of **treated foods**. Other **naysayers** argue that more
10 **stringent** government inspection, higher food-safety standards, and more careful food-preparation practices by consumers are all that is needed to ensure that food is safe. Consequently, companies **currently** see no need to spend millions of dollars supplying processing plants with equipment necessary for a process that few shoppers are in favor of.
